When calls received after hours are not deemed urgent, an investigation is initiated the following day.

Intakes are on a one-night basis although the young person can return as often and as frequently as required. Expectations of the youth are centered on safety. The Shelter Program is intended to open the door to teens who are not yet ready or able to commit to positive lifestyle changes in an effort to keep them safe and hopefully begin a relationship leading to further assistance.
